



This past winter did not provide the type of snowpack necessary to create abundant run-off to recharge the aquifer that supplies our water. In addition, the spring that we rely on for water has also experienced a reduction in flow. I recently took a walk along High Creek and there was little evidence of spring run-off. We are obviously experiencing a drought. I do not like to impose mandatory restrictions and at this time have no intention of doing so. What I do ask is for each of us to watch our water usage and to refrain from outside watering until it is necessary.

Spring is a time of renewal and as a community we like to discard the debris from the winter. Lewiston City is able to provide a large dumpster as a service to the residents, but each year it is abused. It has only been on site a week or two and already our public works employees have had to deal with unacceptable use including trash that was disposed of onsite prior to the arrival of the dumpster. Please use this service wisely and appropriately. It can only be dumped twice a week so if it is full please be kind enough to return with your load when there is room. Also, when unloading make sure anything dumped is fully in the bin and not on the ground.

Another popular service has been the green waste bin. This year Logan City/Cache County has decided to provide the green waste bin for the entire summer and not remove it as was done last year. This service does come with a price and to pay for the service the waste district has increased the monthly fee for each household by \$1.00/month. This price increase will be implemented with the next billing. This fee increase was enacted by the Cache County Council so if you have questions regarding it you will need to contact a County Council member.

Lewiston City plans to hold the traditional 4th of July celebration including all events. Since July 4th is on a Sunday, we will hold the events on Saturday and the rodeo will hold performances on Friday and Saturday.

Regan Wheeler was selected to join the City Council and will serve until the end of 2021 in the place of Debra Wright, who has moved out of the City. 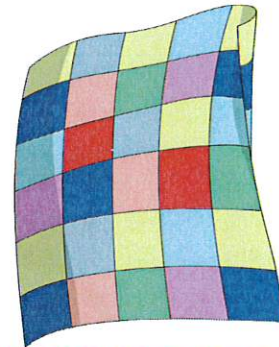
