Mayor's Report

As I was contemplating a subject for this month's newsletter the events in El Paso, Texas and Dayton, Ohio occurred. These events combined with the seeming weekly outbursts of mass terrorism in our country of late influenced me to address this terrible situation and how it affects each and every one of us. After each event there are many politicians that point to their favorite passion, whether it be gun control, mental illness, illegal immigration, radical religion, racism, etc. as the cause of the epidemic. Their plea is if we would only restrict or illuminate any of these issues the problem would go away. All the time using their rhetoric to inflame their supporters.

We need to support one another, our families and associates to combat this evil and eliminate it from our society. I cherish my good fortune to be a citizen of this country and to partake of the many opportunities that it provides. 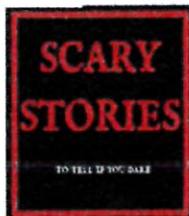
- Playground** - Places where you like to get active: bike paths, playgrounds, parks, tree swings
