MAYOR'S REPORT

2020 has been a year of challenges. The Covid-19 pandemic has wreaked health and economic impacts throughout the world and has brought changes to our lives that we had never even considered as possibilities. There is large political division throughout our nation and communities. Fortunately, our community has not suffered to the extent of some of our neighbors. This, I am sure is due to our faith and willingness to work together to achieve practical solutions to problems and to continue to care for those within our community. As your Mayor, I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy Holiday season. My wish is that we may all show gratitude for the many blessings we do have and have hope for a bright future in the coming year.

During the past month, events have shown how important it is to complete the ongoing water project. Currently Lewiston City culinary water comes from two sources. We have a spring at the mouth of High Creek Canyon that provides gravity flow water and serves as our primary source of water during the winter months and as a major source during the remaining months. The second source of water is a well located in Cove that is used to supplement the spring as needed. The water from the well is pumped to our reservoirs and distributed for use.

The spring has been a reliable source of water for many years including previous periods of drought. Recently the flow from the spring has begun to diminish. At the present time it is unknown if the reduction in flow is due to the drought conditions or from geologic or manmade change. Our Engineers are investigating to determine the cause. Regardless of the reason, the point I wish to make is the importance of bringing an additional water source online to assure we have a reliable supply of water to meet our needs. It is impossible to predict when some event will arise to affect the resource we rely upon.
