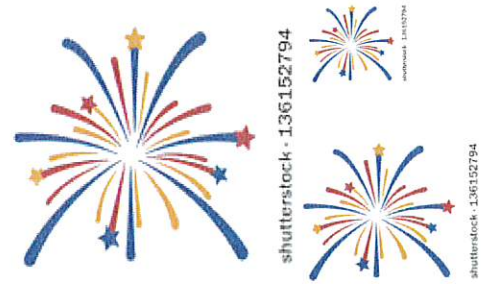

citizens.
