We are currently experiencing a severe drought. The snowpack last winter was minimal and most of the melting snow absorbed into the dry ground and did not fill our reservoirs. In addition, we have seen spring flows diminish and underground aquifers shrink. We have all been asked to reduce our use of water and many cities have imposed strict watering restrictions. Currently Lewiston City does not plan to impose mandatory water restrictions, but to prevent restrictions we do ask that everyone uses water wisely and reduce or eliminate watering when possible. Please avoid watering during the heat of the day (10:00 am to 7:00 pm). This is an ineffective time to water as evaporation of the water exceeds the benefit.

We are all aware that Utah is experiencing rapid population growth. Most of the growth is a result of our own children and grandchildren but there has also been a recent increase in migration from other areas of the country. Up to this time most of the growth in Cache County has occurred south of Lewiston City and has concentrated in the areas surrounding Logan. In the coming years, the growth will move our way and there is already talk of various proposals to build additional homes in Lewiston.

Lewiston is primarily a rural agricultural-based community. The current zoning laws and ordinances encourage the continuation of agriculture. The desire for the current City Council is to support agriculture. With that said one of the base principals of our Country is private ownership and control of property and property owners have rights to use their property as they deem appropriate.

Whenever there is talk of development rumors tend to generate. Please avoid rumors. If you hear of some plan and have concerns, get involved directly with the process. Attend public meetings and learn first-hand about any proposed development. Remember the following points:

- The Lewiston City Planning & Zoning members as well as the City Council share and understand the concern that development brings.
- Property owners have rights.
- There are specific laws and regulations imposed by the State of Utah that Planning & Zoning and the City Council must follow.
- The best way to be heard and to accomplish a desired result is through open discussion and debate and not through anger and clamor.

Planning and Zoning and the City Council will use all the tools available to them to make decisions regarding growth. These tools include the use of outside professional planning resources available through the County, legal advice provided by our attorney, engineering advice as provided by our contracted engineering firm and the defined public hearing process.

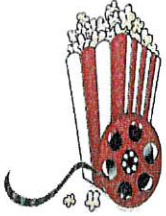
