



The past year has been full of many challenges and uncertainties. COVID-19 has disrupted our lives and has created division and hardship. I feel we have been somewhat fortunate in Cache Valley and in Lewiston City and have weathered the storm. Hopefully, the pandemic is now in decline and with the availability of vaccine improving quickly we will soon be able to put this chapter behind us. Lewiston City is planning to hold all typical events this year without restriction. In addition, with Cache County attaining a moderate classification in the State COVID-19 rating system all city owned facilities are available for use and rental within the requirements of the guidelines. Despite the pandemic, the past year has been a busy one for Lewiston City. The following is a summary of the projects underway.

At present Lewiston City has two culinary water reservoirs located on the hillside east of the town. The older of the reservoirs is showing signs of age and repairs have begun on the roof of the structure so it can continue to serve the city. These repairs will be completed by late spring or early summer.

A test well for a new source of culinary water was drilled in vicinity of the Cub River Sports Complex. The test well was successful and identified a viable source of water to meet our future need. The design and location of the production well is underway and is nearing complete. The current plan is to send the well drilling out for bid by mid-March and to complete the drilling process this year. This new well will also be accompanied with a 1-million-gallon storage reservoir which will be constructed on the northeast corner of the park property.

This project also includes significant upgrades to the water distribution system. The design is approximately 60% complete and is moving rapidly to stage where the improvements can be put out for bid.

The design for the sewer improvements is also moving forward quickly. The entire main sewer line along 200 South will be replaced. The need for a lift station will be eliminated in this improvement and the sewer line will move out of the road to the south of the homes along Sugar Lane so it can go to the south of Presto Products. The current line goes under portions of the Presto Products facility which is not ideal for either Lewiston City or Presto Products.

The sewer project will also include improvements at the lagoons. The design of this portion of the project is currently ready for the 90% design review. After the review that portion of the project will be ready for bid.

As these projects advance, I will provide updates. These improvements are the largest public works projects ever undertaken by Lewiston City. The purpose is to provide necessary infrastructure to serve our city into the future.
