### Mayor's Report

There are some exciting new things available to the citizens of Lewiston. First, after months of work and sometimes frustration we have a new website. This website allows our city staff to have complete control of the information on the site. With this we always have the opportunity to keep it current and to add or remove information quickly. Our goal is to provide the information you need to be informed about our city. A second exciting new feature we now have is an online communication system. This system will allow Lewiston City to contact you electronically in the event of an emergency or to provide information such as a problem with water delivery or even city events. Many residents have already provided us with contact information that will allow us to notify them. If you have not provided such information, please

take the opportunity so we can make contact when necessary. The form is available on the website or you can complete a physical form in the city office.

There will be a municipal election this year to fill three city council seats. This is a great way to serve your community and to also learn the challenges faced by local government. The sign-up period will be in early June and I encourage any interested citizens to take this opportunity to get involved.

The Little Red Riding Hood bicycle event will be centered in Lewiston again this year. The event will be held on June 1 and will bring many people to town. The event actually kicks off on Friday night, May 31. Many of our residents are involved in this event serving as hosts to participants or a volunteer for the event. Although this event can cause some inconvenience due to the numbers of bicyclists on the road, the event organizers have always been great to work with and they typically make a mone-

tary donation which is used to support our local parks and recreation. This event is widely known throughout the country and reflects positively on our community. I travel frequently and it has been common in discussion with a stranger on an airplane to mention I am from Lewiston, UT and to have them respond that they know where Lewiston is located because they have participated in the event. 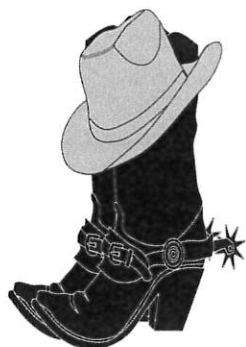
