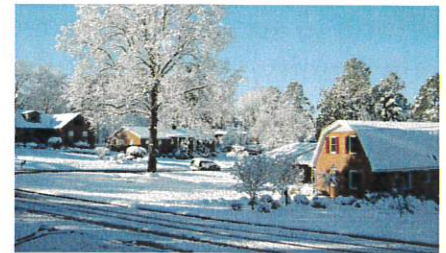

Beginning November 15th the Lewiston City winter parking regulations go into effect. Please be sure to keep vehicles off the streets between the hours of 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. through March 15th.

Winter parking regulations were enacted to keep streets clear should the Public Works Department need to clear the roadways after a snowstorm. However, the ordinance applies whether or not there is snow on the ground.

Please keep your vehicles off the road to ensure plows can get through. It is also very helpful to pull your garbage containers in from the roadway as soon as possible after pickup.
