

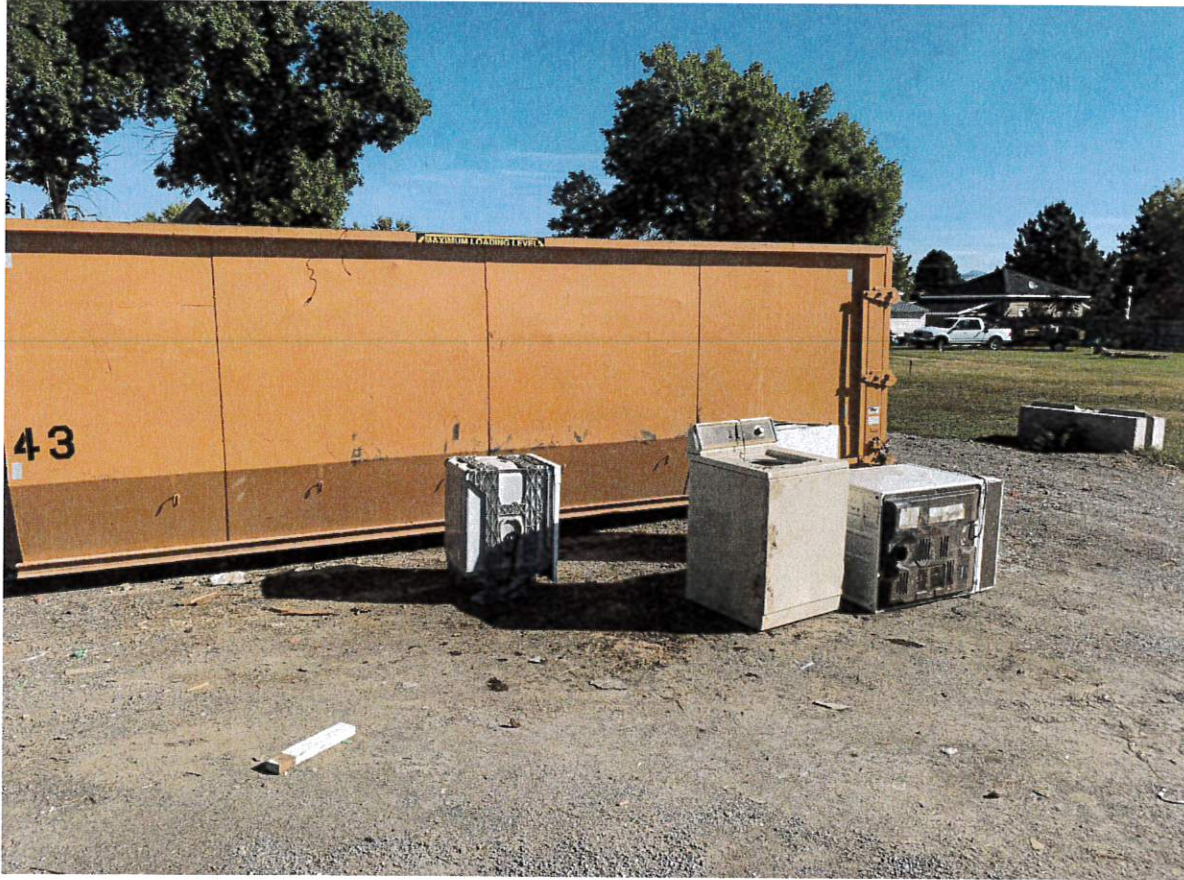

## Mayor's Report

Many residents braved the cold and the rain and enjoyed a fun picnic on September 20. If you missed our annual picnic, I encourage you to attend next year. It is a fun way for the city to say thanks to all residents. I also extend thanks to the dedicated city staff and council members that make this event an ongoing success.

As the summer ends, I need to again address a continuing concern with the popular dumpster service that we are able to provide. Continuation of this service depends on the correct use of service by the citizens. When I visited the dumpster several weeks ago with a load of my own, I witnessed the scene in the following photo.



All materials must be placed in the dumpster. We do not have staff and equipment to load the dumpster. If the items are too heavy to be placed in the dumpster, they must be taken to the transfer station in Logan for disposal. Another ongoing problem is overfilling of the dumpster. If you arrive and the dumpster is full please do not dump it on the ground. The dumpster is emptied frequently, but the schedule is out of our control. Failure to follow these common courtesies threatens the continuation of this program.

We have been working with our engineers to address required improvements to our water and sewer systems. Our current systems are beginning to show signs of age and in order to ensure dependable service into the future we have reached a point where we will need to make some significant improvements. We have been fortunate over the past several years to enjoy lower rates than many of our neighbors. Unfortunately, systems do age and improvements must be made. Over the next several months I will dedicate this space to explain the improvements and the associated costs.
