MAYOR'S REPORT

2021 continues to be a year of challenges full of unforeseen events. We have experienced drought, smoke, resurgence of COVID-19 and now primary election issues.

Just prior to the primary election for the two-year open council seat all the candidates were disqualified by the state because they failed to submit the required election financial report to the state. Elections in Utah are run by the state through the

County Clerk's office in each county. The disqualification was determined by the state of Utah and the County Clerk was directed to discard the ballots and the election was declared void.

This was a very unfortunate event and in my years of service I have never witnessed such a disqualification. I am saddened that it did happen.

The two-year council seat is still available, and the person elected

to fill the position will be determined by a write-in vote. No names will be listed on that ballot for that seat in the general election. It is my understanding that each of the disqualified candidates have filed as write-in candidates, and I urge you to listen to their platforms and to vote for your preferred candidate on election day. The candidates for the position are Ned Simper, Brenda Link, Kade Tarbet and Regan Wheeler.

Message from Cache Mosquito Abatement District

The species of mosquitos that the Cache Mosquito Abatement District is getting calls for is the *Aedes Dorsalis*. It is a brilliant gold-colored aggressive day-biting mosquito that breeds in a variety of brackish and freshwater habitats. Total developmental time, from egg to adult, has been observed to occur in less than one week. The eggs are laid on plants and muddy areas of these wetlands and hatch when the breeding site is filled by high tides or spring rains. Adults are an aggressive daytime biting species capable of traveling up to 30 miles from their breeding habitat although typical dispersal patterns are less than 10 miles from the marshes in search of a blood meal. The bite of the female has been described as vicious and biting occurs most often during the daylight hours and at dusk. They prefer open habitats such as grasslands, salt marshes, and vegetation. Females are readily attracted to green, grassy fields and will rest there waiting for available hosts. Eggs are laid singly on the mud along the edge of tidal pools or the receding waterline of brackish seasonal wetlands. Additional hatches occur with subsequent reflooding of the larval habitat. It should be noted that the eggs can remain viable for many years (7-10 years) with only part of any one batch of laid eggs hatching during any single flooding event. Adults are most active at temperatures ranging from 50-95 degrees F with activity ceasing at temperatures below 42 degrees F.

As a mosquito abatement district, we are doing our best to control the mosquitos. The type of mosquito and their behavior make it difficult to control with spraying because of the nature of them being a day time biter. Please be proactive and wear long-sleeve pants and shirts and use appropriate mosquito repellent.

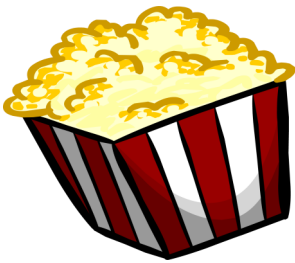


ADULT READING MARATHON
