Mayor's Report

This seems to be the year to address the ever present challenges of meeting continually increasing costs of providing infrastructure and services and balancing them with the resources and costs to the citizens. This month I have an actual example to use as an illustration. If you have a chance take a drive south along 1600 West to Conference Road. You will notice that the southernmost mile of that road consists of new pavement. This new pavement is the culmination of a three year project that was undertaken to address heavy truck traffic and severe deteriorization along that road. The cost of this project was in excess of \$500,000. It has required direct participation from the taxpayers of Lewiston City, Ritewood Egg and the Cache County Council of Governments to complete.

Lewiston City has over 40 miles of roads within its boundaries so simple math would show that if we were to resurface all of the roads within our boundaries the cost at a minimum would be in the range of \$20,000,000. With an annual General Fund budget of approximately \$1,000,000 one can

see this is an impossible task and there is certainly no plan to attempt such a task. However, over time each mile of roadway within Lewiston City will need to be rehabilitated as will all other infrastructure maintained by Lewiston City.

As a Council we are always seeking ways of providing the necessary services to the residents at a fair cost. To accomplish this task we are working to enlarge the tax base by bringing in businesses compatible with our culture and heritage. You may have noticed some development work on the east end of SR61 (Center Street). Several years ago, that property was purchased by the Sewer Department for use to extend the life of the sewage lagoons. There was always an excess of property and it has been on the market for several Now with an improved economy several lots have been sold and some businesses will be locating in Lewiston. This will bring some property that has either been in greenbelt or owned by Lewiston City onto the tax rolls to help provide funds for the future.

We are always looking for new ideas on methods to address these
