

# Lewiston City Newsletter

## Mayor's Report

Last month I reviewed the sources of the money that make up the general fund. The general fund income is approximately \$1,050,000. This month I will review where the general fund income is spent. For the current fiscal year the expenses from largest to smallest are as follow:

Streets	\$249,500
(This includes expenses such as employee salaries, snow removal, lighting, signage, equipment and road repairs)	
Garbage Collection	\$160,500
General Operations	\$156,000
(This budget includes expenses such as employee benefits, retirement, payroll taxes, liability insurance legal services, computer services, accounting services, audit services, public notices and office supplies.)	
Theatre	\$ 60,000
City Recorder	\$ 56,000
Library	\$ 45,500
Court	\$ 41,000
(This includes expenses for judge and clerk salaries, legal services and surcharges imposed by the State on fines collected)	
Fire Department	\$ 37,500
Building Operations	\$ 36,000
(The majority of the building operations expense is for utilities for the city buildings)	
Police	\$ 34,500
This expense includes contract services with the Cache County Sheriff, 911 emergency center operations and emergency radio fees)	
4 <sup>th</sup> of July	\$ 33,500
Planning and Zoning	\$ 25,500
(\$20,000 of this expense are fees collected from building permits for building inspection)	
Parks and Recreation	\$ 20,200
City Council	\$ 18,000
(This expense includes the budget for the operation of the youth council, annual city picnic, etc.)	
Treasurer	\$ 17,350
Cemetery	\$ 17,000
Cub River Sports Complex	\$ 12,000
(Cub River Sports Complex is jointly operated by Lewiston and Richmond also contributes a like amount to its operation)	
Executive (Mayor)	\$ 8500
Animal Control	\$ 8500
Crossing Guard	\$ 3000
Arts Council	\$ 2900

This is a summary of the expenses from the general fund. The budget categories in the city budget provide much greater detail of each department expense. I believe the residents of Lewiston City get a great value from the taxes and fees collected. This value is due to the work of dedicated city employees and volunteers as well as careful elected officials who have served over the years. There are many financial challenges facing us and each city in today's world. It is common for both the federal and state governments to impose unfunded mandates on the local governments and demand they be met. Technological advances do not come without cost and there are ever increasing costs of providing health, medical and retirement benefits to employees. 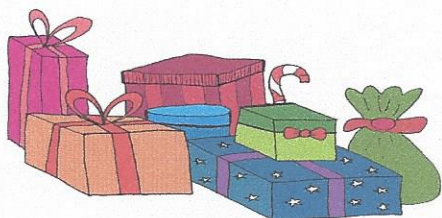

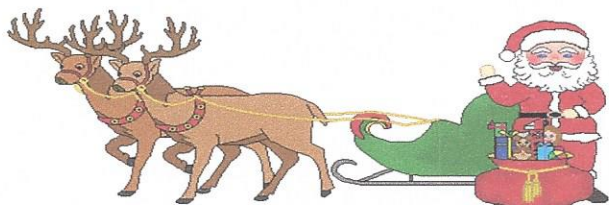
